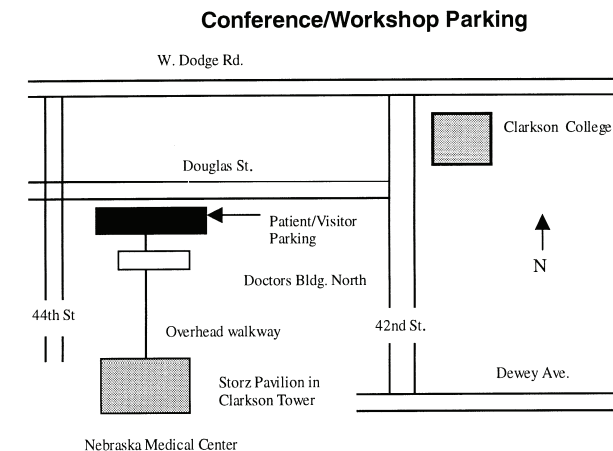
## Location
